HIGHLIGHTS AND NEXT STEPS

- Commissioner Brotherton <u>re: Emergency Generator</u> Brinnon Fire Dept is getting bids for the generator – and will possibly be able to get FEMA funding to support the procurement. The plan is to use the fire station as a gathering/warming center in the case of another weather event, and the Brinnon school will supplement because they have kitchen facilities and are adjacent to the Fire station.
- Sheriff Nole re: naloxone supply: No update at this time.
- Jim Novelli <u>re: Harm Reduction Vending machine</u>. Met with Thea Olyphant-Wells from King County who is working on a similar project in King County and also met with the Public Health Harm Reduction Vending machine round-table. Many states are putting in 20-30 machines. The machines dispense items such as NarCan using a QR code procured from the "owner".
- Lori noted Chief Manly had noted the Brinnon Community Center would be a good place to have one of these machines, along with the Ferry Terminal.
- Chief McKern noted they support a machine as long as the Sheriff can keep an eye on it possible at the Post Office.

- Denise Banker noted JCPH has trained their front Staff and practitioners in a step to ultimately distributing naloxone so anyone coming into the JCPH Clinic can get it at any time.
- Laurie Tinker noted she will track to see if JHC might want to be out front doing this sort of vending machine. Jim Novelli will reach out to his connections in Omak, WA, where the FQHC has one. Possibilities for a machine out in the parking lot, to the side of the emergency room entrance.
- Need to figure out education for the community; Budget for a vending machine; who will stock it, who will own it, etc.
- <u>EMS Council update/Laurie Tinker</u>: Next meeting is Monday and will be led by Chief Manly. May have insight around if the EMS Council will be taking the challenges of rural site transport and bringing their rural perspective to the legislature.
- <u>PH info that could go into JHC discharge packets</u>: Dr. Smith is adding this to the discharge check-off list from the ED.
- Community Resource Yellow Cards should be available within the next week.
- Lori reviewed potential HRSA Grant 22-061: see latest work plan components (as of 3/18).
