
School Based Health Clinic Overview

The Behavioral Health Summit January 24, 2023

What is a School Based Health Center (SBHC)

- A health clinic on the school campus that is accessible, yet separate from the school, allowing the maintenance of health clinic confidentiality.
- Includes comprehensive medical and mental health services by licensed health care providers and counselors





How the SBHCs Began

Mike Blair, Former Superintendent of Chimacum Schools initiated the effort

- 2007 JCPH received WA Department of Health Planning grant for Chimacum and Port Townsend's School Based Health Centers
- Intention was for DOH to offer two operating grants the following year.
 However, this did not happen due to economic downturn
- 2008-2009 School Year JCPH regrouped and opened Chimacum & PT SBHCs
 - Partnership between JCPH, JHC and Schools
 - Medical bill Medicaid, insurance/programs/general fund
 - Mental health 1/10th of 1% tax
- 2018-20 Quilcene school district and community request SBHC
- Spring 2021 the Quilcene SBHC opened



Overview of Jefferson County Youth Health

Twenty-seven percent of 10th and 47% of Jefferson County 12th graders report ever having had sex (HYS 2021).

Notably, in 2020, Jefferson County has a lower teen (age 15-19) pregnancy rate at 7 per 1,000 compared to

Washington at 17 per 1,000. (WA State Dept. of Health, Community Health Assessment Tool, December 2021). In
2020, Jefferson's rate of sexually transmitted infections in people aged 15-19 (8 per 1,000) was lower than

Washington's (13.6 per 1,000) (WA State Dept. of Health, Community Health Assessment Tool, April 2022).

Referrals

Referrals are made to agencies/professionals, based on evaluated situation:

- SBHC mental health counselor
- SAP (Student Assistance Professional) at school, usually for SUD of student and/or family/guardian
- DBH for eval and services
- Anne Koomen, ARNP, through JHC Primary Care Provider
- EMS for crisis
- CPS when appropriate
- CHINS (Children in Need of Services). Students are connected with
 CHINS program when home environment needs support/solutions.
- Truancy folks at courthouse sometimes this may be the only option to be able to check on the safety of a student.



SBHC Mental Health Service Funding

- 1 day/week at each school = 1/10th of 1% tax
- 1 day/week at each school = DOH SBHC grant 2021-2022
- 1 day/week at each school = other funding


